Title of Bill:

Immigration Reform Act

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ANIMAS HIGH SCHOOL MODEL CONGRESS

1 Preamble: Whereas there are 11 million undocumented immigrants living in the United
2 States and more crossing the border every day, and since 58 percent of the illegal
3 immigration population comes from Mexico, and since the number of children born to at
4 least one unauthorized-immigrant parent is 350,000, and since the number of immigrants is
5 rising and approaching levels that haven’t been seen since the early 20th century, and since
6 there are 21 thousand Americans working border control,

8 SECTION 1: Increase programs to prevent illegal immigrants from entering the U.S. by--

9 Sub-SECTION A: Recognizing border patrol positions as military personnel, and
10 subsequently leaking 2% of military funding into border patrol funding for
11 additional equipment and forces.

12 Sub-SECTION B: Increasing border patrol size by 30%, border areas monitored by
13 700 miles, and number of patrols by 30%.

15 SECTION 2: Make immigrating to the U.S. legally easier than immigrating to the U.S.
16 illegally by--

17 Sub-SECTION A: Providing existing immigrants of over 5 years to legally apply for
18 temporary citizenship/work visas.

19 Sub-SECTION B: Allowing immigrants to come to the U.S. under a work visa as
20 long as they attend a United States University, granting citizenship to them after
21 graduating from the aforementioned university with at least a bachelor’s degree, dis-
22 enrolling will result in deportation.

23 Sub-SECTION C: Granting immigrants attending U.S. universities in-state tuition
24 rates.

25 Sub-SECTION D: Granting immigrants with collegiate bachelor degrees or higher a
26 work visa for 5 years. Followed by the opportunity to apply for a permanent U.S.
27 citizenship after 4 years.

28
29 SECTION 3: Make welfare and receiving social security checks available only to
30 immigrants who have been a legal United States citizen for at least 15 years, as long as all
31 other criteria for these programs are met.

33 SECTION 4: This bill must be implemented within one year and six months after passing in
34 the United States Senate.
