Title of Bill:

The Act to Reduce the Disrupting and Ugly Affects of the Wearing of Uggs (ARDUAWU)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ANIMAS HIGH SCHOOL MODEL SENATE

1 Preamble: Whereas Ugg boots have been a popular trend with the younger generation, and
2 are known as boots that make your feet look particularly large and unattractive, yet seen by
3 younger people to be good-looking, comfortable, and well-equipped for the outdoors, the
4 more mature generation has concluded that they are ascetically displeasing because of the
5 many different ways in which they are styled: some believe they are most striking when
6 they are folded over to the ankles which creates a protrusion of fake fur, and since some use
7 them outdoors to prove that they can weather the elements, they tumble down because of the
8 lack of tread on the bottom of the shoe, and since worn outside, the rain and snow discolors
9 the boot to the color of puke green, and since the Ugg boots are overpriced and are of poor
10 craftsmanship, and they are a disgrace to boots everywhere,

12 SECTION 1: Let it be unlawful for an individual to possess Uggs or any product derived
13 from the same manufacturer.

14 Sub-SECTION A: The possession of any product of Uggs shall be punished by a
15 fine of \$60,000 or up to 3 years in prison.

17 SECTION 2: Let it be unlawful for a business to sell or distribute Uggs in any capacity.

18 Sub-SECTION A: The growth or distribution of Uggs will be punished by a fine of
19 \$4.66 or 25 years in prison.

21 SECTION 3: Let it be unlawful to import or export Uggs.

22 Sub-SECTION A: The importation or exportation of Uggs will be punished by Ugging

23 Sub-Sub-SECTION A: Ugging will be defined as throwing Uggs at a
24 constrained individual until death.

26 SECTION 4: Exceptions will only be allowed when Uggs are used by children under the
27 age of 5 years old.
